## DEERS AND DANCIN'



A walk through Sligachan Glen at dusk is a great time to see deer and stags roaming through the bracken and bog lands. If you're lucky you might spot an eagle, too.

Après hike, Seumas' Bar has hundreds of different types of whisky, hearty homemade meals and live music at the weekends.



## A WALK BACK IN TIME

Visit the community shop and pack a picnic before embarking on hike to the ancient cleared village of Hallaig, past a monument to acclaimed Gaelic poet Sorely MacLean, famous for his poem about the village.

Finish your day with a drink at the iconic Raasay Distillery, and watch the sun set over the Cuillin mountains.



## BIKING AND BEACHES

Hire mountain bikes and spend the morning on the forestry trails at Skinadin - fueled by artisan coffee and cardamon buns from the Lean To in Breakish.

In the afternoon, take a hike to Ashaig beach at low tide and spend a few hours rockpooling, wild swimming and drinking up the amazing view - especially stunning at sunset.

For dinner, Cafe Sia create delicious tuscan style pizzas in their wood fired ovens and have a delightful wine list too.



## THE SOUND OF SLEAT

Ever-changing seascapes across the Sound of Sleat have created vast beaches, perfect for a stroll in the low autumn sun. The white sands and views to the small isles make the Point of Sleat our favourite walk.



Visit the An Crùbh centre for afternoon tea in their new cafe, built in a stunning location overlooking the mountainous mainland. This is a great spot for kids!

Whisky fans can also visit the nearby Torabhaig distillery for a tour of the impressive grounds.
